

Is Tajikistan moving its energy sector towards more reliability?

With an aging electricity supply that relies almost entirely on one source of power generation, hydropower, Tajikistan has a uniquely unstable power supply that has caused energy shortages and rolling blackouts for decades. Now, Tajikistan appears to be moving its energy sector towards greater reliability and sustainability.

What is the power system of Tajikistan?

In Tajikistan, the power system has a total installed capacity of 5190 MW, with 93.9% (or 4973.142 MW) coming from hydro power plants. The remaining 6.1% (or 318 MW) comes from thermal power plants.

Should Brussels invest in Tajik energy?

Brussels seems also to view investments in Tajik energy as a way to offset a much more intense adversary: Russia. The traditional regional hegemon in Central Asia, Russia has control over Tajikistan's second-largest hydropower plant, Sangtuda-2, and continues to import most of its petroleum, 63.3%, from Moscow.

Does Saudi Arabia invest in Tajik energy?

Saudi Arabia is also investing more in Tajik energy. Riyadh has invested \$100 million in the ongoing construction of the Rogun dam and in January, Ambassador of Tajikistan to Saudi Arabia Akram Karimi met with the Saudi Secretary General of the Public Investment Fund to discuss future plans for Saudi involvement in Tajik green energy.

Why is China important to Tajikistan's hydropower sector?

China is an important investor for Tajikistan's hydropower sector. In 2020, China upgraded Tajikistan's Golovnaya Hydropower Station, after having renovated it two previous times. In May 2023, the China-led Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank provided \$500 million in soft loans to help construct the colossal Rogun hydroelectric plant.

Does Russia control Tajikistan?

The traditional regional hegemon in Central Asia, Russia has control over Tajikistan's second-largest hydropower plant, Sangtuda-2, and continues to import most of its petroleum, 63.3%, from Moscow. EU officials are much more explicit about their investments in Tajikistan curtailing Moscow's influence.

Tajikistan's energy authorities denied Kazakhstan's accusations as baseless. They noted at the time that Tajikistan does not have technical feasibility to siphon off electricity from the Central Asian power grid. Uzbekistan officially left the regional power grid that united the country with its three Central Asian neighbors in December 2009.

The Majlisi Milli (Tajikistan's upper chamber of parliament) has seconded the law banning "alien garments" and children's celebrations for two major Islamic holidays -- Eid al-Fitr (Idi Ramazon) and Eid Al-Adha (Idi Qurbon), known as idgardak (children visit houses of their street or village and congratulate people with Islamic holidays Ramazon or Qurbon).

The Government of Tajikistan has abolished the preferential customs clearance procedure for mobile phones brought into the country for personal use. The decision (Decree No. 442) was made on July 31, 2024, First Deputy Head of the Customs Service under the Government of Tajikistan, Azim Tursunzoda, told reporters in Dushanbe on August 7.

Recall, nearly all of Tajikistan was hit by a blackout on October 28, 2016, following an unexpected outage at

its largest power producer, the Nurek hydroelectric power plant. The blackout affected the capital city Dushanbe and all other areas of the country except for the GBAO, which receives electricity from another supplier, Pamir Energy Company.

Russia's Inter RAO YeES and the Ministry of Energy and Industries of Tajikistan signed an agreement on the establishment of the company in Dushanbe on February 16, 2005. Russia owns 75% percent of the shares minus one share and Tajikistan assumes the 25% ownership interest plus one share in Sangtudinskaya GES-1.
